Teams:	3 or 4 riders and one Stable Manager (SM). DCs/CAs must determine that members are safe to compete at chosen level, given the technical nature of show jumping courses.
Divisions:	Competitors may enter Qualifying or Non-Qualifying divisions based on the horse/rider ability and DC/CA approval.
	Non-QualifyingNon-qualifying divisions are open to D-3s and up on appropriate mounts. Very strongD-2 Trad/HSE on quiet, safe mounts with written permission from the DC/CA may also enter. All non-qualifying level competitors will jump four numbered rounds. They will not have a jump-off or Take Your Own Line (TYOL) round.NQ1horse or pony $2'0" - 2'3"$ up to $2'6"$ NQ3horse or large pony** $2'6" - 2'9"$ * will jump the Introductory level course. No combinations, jump off, or TYOL.

** a large pony is over 13.2 hands but not larger than 14.2 hands.

Qualifying

Competitors attempting to qualify for Championships must meet the following age and certification requirements:

Introductory	12 years or older	D-3 Trad/HSE and up
Developing Horse/Rider	12 years or older	D-3 Trad/HSE and up
Regular/Modified	12 years or older	C-1 Trad/HSE and up
Stable Manager	12 years or older	D-3 HM and up
Note: members not meeting these requirements may compete in qualifying divisions with		

the approval of their DC/CA.

Qualifications for Championships:

To qualify, the same horse/rider combination must have competed over three courses at the same level at their regional or interregional qualifying show jumping rally. The horse/rider may not have been eliminated in any qualifying course for any reason (including any rule or technical infractions in the competition arena or schooling area) or have more than 12 jumping faults over the three qualifying rounds of the rally. Large ponies ridden by B or A certified members may compete at Horse II level, but must be able to handle distances specified for horses. In addition, members attempting to qualify in Introductory, DHR, Modified (Horse I, Large Pony), or Regular (Horse II-IV) must complete a TYOL course as their fourth round; however, TYOL will not be scored or considered a qualifying round.

VRPC ranking criteria for Championships selection are based on the competitor's scores in rounds 1-3 (jump off score not included) and their Horse Management scores. TYOL (round 4) will not be scored or included in Championships selection. TYOL is offered to provide an opportunity for competitors to plan and ride a TYOL round, which is included at Championships.

Fees:Entry fee \$122 per VRPC competitor; \$172 per out-of-region competitor. Entry fee
includes stall for Friday & Saturday nights and 2 bags of shavings. Additional bags of
shavings may be ordered when entering for \$8 per bag or may be purchased on
grounds for \$10.00 per bag. No straw bedding allowed. No fee for Stable Managers.
Out of region competitors use code OutofRegion when registering online.

Payment:	Invoices and payment receipts are generated by the system and emailed to the member. Online payment may be made with a member's personal credit or debit card through the VRPC website when registering an individual. Payment receipts must be sent to the Rally Secretary by the Club closing date (May 26).

Volunteers:	A minimum of three volunteers per team entry are required. One of these volunteers must be designated for HM. A minimum of one volunteer per scramble entry is required.

Food:	Available in Leesburg; none on grounds.
General:	 Competitors may arrive on Friday, between 3:00 and 7:00 pm, but no later than 7:00 p.m Friday arrivals must be arranged with the rally secretary. Only stalls may be set up. Equipment may be unloaded, but no tack rooms may be set up on Friday. Stalls must be stripped and swept before departure. Additional shavings may be purchased on grounds for \$10.00 per bag; no straw bedding allowed.

- Competitors are required to wear their Medical Armband (containing their current USPC or USEA Medical Card) or a Medical Bracelet for the duration of the rally.
- > Barn appropriate footwear is required at all times.
- > Only the team captain or appointed designee may pick up registration packets.
- > Chaperones must be available on-site for the duration of the rally.
- There will not be a horse inspection on Sunday; however, if a rider or official is concerned about a horse's well-being, they can request to jog at any point during the competition.
