# Meeting Minutes

- I. Call to Order/Introductions Carrie Camp, RSa. The meeting was called to order at 9:10 a.m.
- II. Approval of the Minutes Anne Williams, Secretary
  - a. MOTION: Michelle Arnold moved that the minutes from the February 19, 2017, Regional Council meeting be approved as presented. Gale Winfree duly seconded the motion.
    - i. DISCUSSION: Anne Williams noted that Jennifer Carpenter pointed out in the spring that there is an error in the minutes regarding the out of region fee

for Polocrosse rally. The minutes currently read that the fee does apply to Polocrosse.

- ii. Michelle Arnold WITHDREW her motion.
- b. MOTION: Jennifer Carpenter moved that the minutes from the February 19, 2017 Regional Council meeting be approved with the correction that the out of region fee would NOT apply to Polocrosse rally in 2017. Erin White duly seconded the motion. There was no discussion.
  - i. VOTE: 12 in favor; 2 abstained. Motion carried.
- III. Regional Supervisor's Report Carrie Camp, RS
  - a. Carrie delivered an overview of the activities in 2017, which included kudos to rally organizers, HM staff, the RIC committee, and Dawn Bellinger for their hard work.
  - b. Carrie provided a financial review from the 2017 activities. SEE ATTACHMENT A
    - i. DISCUSSION: There is a profit reflected for both Champs and the National Test because the Region did not spend as much as they collected. Camp explained that that money would be absorbed in the general fund, but we can decide to provide refunds to those who went to Champs and paid a coaching fee. There is no line item for money collected for Champs as income because this financial snapshot reflects net gain.
- IV. Activities Report Lisa Woods, Vice RS, Activities
  - a. Lisa Woods applauded the efforts that were made to keep our rally expenses low. In 2015, we lost approximately \$9,000, in 2016, we lost approximately \$5,000, but in 2017, we only lost \$900.
    - i. The attendance for the rallies in 2017 was:
      - 1. D Rallies 39
      - 2. Dressage 63
      - 3. Eventing 38
      - 4. Games 22
      - 5. Horseless 12
      - 6. Polocrosse 26
      - 7. Quiz 70
      - 8. Show Jumping 76
  - b. Carrie Camp noted the following for 2018:
    - i. Eventing Rally will be at a different site since we are not able to use Glenwood Park. We could try and use Deep Run Hunt Club, but scheduling is limited at that venue. Carrie has reached out to Morven Park. They are willing to work with us on a price. Other options included following MOC to wherever they are able to put on their horse trials and combine the two, or use the same venue; Kelly's Ford; Great Meadows; Virginia Horse Trials in Lexington; or Lochmoy. Many of these options would involve temporary stalls which is cost-prohibitive. The consensus was to try for Morven Park.
    - ii. We would like to continue with the progression of having Dressage Rally first, then Show Jumping, and then Eventing. To do this, it would be ideal to

have Dressage Rally in April, Show Jumping in May and Eventing in June, but it is unlikely that can occur due to venue and scheduling conflicts.

iii. Dressage and Tet rallies will be held during the same weekend in 2018.

Competitors will not have to choose between the two disciplines – they can do both.

# V. RIC Report - Mary Schwentker, for Cathy Frederickson, RIC

- a. The preps this year were well-attended (including some out of Region kids) and useful for the members who came. The goal for this year (and what will continue in 2018) is to have the kids who attend the preps to be in front of two National Examiners at a time.
- b. There was a struggle getting kids to sign up, or having them sign up and then not have to pay so they weren't committed and felt they could back out at any minute without a consequence. Some suggestions to resolve this issue were:
  - i. Alter the registration so that kids aren't registered until they have paid;
  - ii. Impose a late fee;
  - iii. Tighten the rules on deadlines; and
  - iv. Have more DC oversight in ensuring kids commit to the preps.
    - The RIC Committee will take these options under advisement, and in the meantime, Dawn will give the RIC Committee access to the registration information in Wild Apricot.
- c. The RIC Committee would like to move our August National Test to October. There are other tests in our zone in August, which would mean that those who wish to test and are in college would have options to do so.
- d. Unmounted HB & HA prep dates for 2018 are January 7th, February 4th & February 18th.

- b. Membership
  - i. Please keep up with the changes in dues so that you are sending checks in the correct amount.
  - ii. Jennifer Carpenter noted that the Wild Apricot system doesn't always produce the correct certifications in the rally lists, so reminded rally organizers to check the USPC site for the correct information.
- c. Wild Apricot
  - i. The Council was asked to consider whether we should continue to use the Wild Apricot system since our rates have increased from \$50 per month to \$70 per month. The consensus was to continue to use it.
- d. Zones
  - i. USPC is encouraging the use of "zones" which would comprise of Regions. Zones would give kids more opportunities, especially for testings and preps.

e. Advertising

- i. Dawn has worked very hard to distribute information about the Region. A volunteer is needed to take over the Google Ad key words. We have a \$10,000/month grant from Google to monitor ad words.
- ii. New banners will be ordered
- iii. New tri-fold brochures will be printed. They will have space for club's address labels.
- iv. Dawn reminded the Region to be patient with these new advertising ideas.
- v. Erin White suggested that the website have more information about what clubs do, not just where they are.
- vi. Dawn was applauded for her hard work on this advertising venture.

VIII. Budget

- a. A Draft 2018 Budget was presented. See ATTACHMENT C
- b. Annual Meeting
  - i. Carrie proposed that the RS select two (2) Council Officers to attend Annual Meeting.
  - ii. Carrie proposed that for the NYC candidate, their travel budget would be \$500, \$150 for meals, and registration fee paid for by the Region.
  - iii. Dawn asked if someone on the Council wanted to donate the cost of attending Annual Meeting to VRPC, could VRPC then use that money to send the donor to the meeting. Carrie said that was acceptable.
- c. MOTION: Erin White moved to approve the proposal for the travel expenses for NYC candidate. Michelle Arnold duly seconded the motion. VOTE: All in favor, none opposed; Motion carries.
- d. MOTION: Michelle Arnold moved to approve the 2018 Budget as proposed. Gail Winfree duly seconded the motion.
  - i. DISCUSSION: Rally fee structure (See OPTION 1 and OPTION 2 at the bottom of ATTACHMENT C)
    - 1. The consensus was that no one thought Option 2 was a good idea.
    - 2. It was noted that Polocrosse was not listed on either option. Carrie proposed \$35 as the fee, but that the out of region fee would apply.
    - 3. OUTCOME: Motion withdrawn
- e. MOTION: Anne Williams moved to accept the budget presented using rally fee schedule Option 1 and with a \$35 entry fee for Polocrosse but the out of Region fee would apply. Michelle Arnold duly seconded the motion. VOTE: all in favor, none opposed. Motion carries.

## Virginia Region Pony Clubs VRS Administration Report November 11, 2017

#### Membership -

Renewals are going well because most clubs are asking their members to renew online. Only glitch is when clubs send checks for \$20 renewal fee instead of \$26 which is the 2018 rate. Please ask your membership coordinators to change their formula. The renewal fee for 2018 is \$26 and the late fee (for after Nov 15) is \$13.

To date our 10 clubs/2 riding center membership is at 241 broken out by club/center as:

#### Communications -

Our Wild Apricot fees went up this year from \$50/mo to \$70/mo with a10% discount for paying annually. Now that we know that USPC has only recently submitted the Rally Registration piece to USEF for build out in their system, this officer will review the software available in the marketplace to replace WA and make a recommendation at the February meeting at which point a decision will be required if we want to implement it in 2019. The WA system provides us with a website, email communications, membership, event registration and newsletter templates. It has dramatically cut down on volunteer time required and improved communication and coordination at the regional level. An "all-in-one" package such as WA is recommended in the future unless and until USPC has something similar to replace it.

# Advertising -

A number of efforts have been underway in the Virginia Region to increase our membership.

We've placed 4 full-page ads in Horse Times magazine and have renewed for next year. Horse Times is a free publication circulated to all of Virginia. In addition, HT has asked us to submit articles. To date, we've had three articles written by: Morgan Gerald (won our members' writing contest), HMO Carla Wright, and RIC Cathy Fredrickson. HT gave Morgan an embroidered horse cooler as an award.

We created 5000 bookmarks for distribution to the general public at various horse friendly events. A small packet of bookmarks with a cover letter was mailed to over 500 equine businesses in the zip codes near our current club areas. That distribution list is on our website under "Supporters." In addition, a large packet of bookmarks was mailed to our leadership with a separate cover letter asking them to

distribute the bookmarks to our membership and encourage them to circulate to their friends.

We have consistently created paid advertisements on Facebook which has grown our page "Likes" this year from 495 to 696. The idea here is to increase our social network impact so that there is continual "buzz" in the ether around our brand. To date, the most successful advertisement has been a post about an upcoming Tutoring Tuesday by the co-inventor of Flair Equine Nasal Strips (this Tuesday, Nov 14<sup>th</sup>) with 9751 reaches, 270 reactions and 78 shares!

We have been using our Google Adwords Grant to place advertisements on google search results with keywords such as "riding lessons," "horseback riding," and "pony club" within specific zip codes near our current club and center distribution. We could use help maintaining our Adwords campaign if anyone knows any parent who has Adwords experience and might be available to assist in this effort.

Plans continue into 2018 as well. We will be hosting a booth at the Washington International Horse Show with Capital & Maryland regions. We will be ordering new VRPC banners to replace the old inaccurate ones. We will have ready for distribution at Quiz rally a new glossy trifold brochure about pony club with a space for each club to add an address label sticker with their contact information. Increasing membership organically takes time and is difficult to evaluate the success. Hopefully, each club and center is seeing increased inquiries, which is the first step. At the regional level, we have had positive reactions from the community and have forwarded a few inquiries on to the appropriate people.
